

ORDINANCE NO. IV (H)

AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE REQUISITES OF A PIECE OF PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF PAYNE SPRINGS, TEXAS, ON WHICH ANY ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE MAY BE SOLD, SERVED OR CONSUMED IF THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IS EVER LEGALIZED IN THE CITY OF PAYNE SPRINGS, TEXAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF PAYNE SPRINGS, TEXAS:

Section 1: This entire Ordinance is and shall be deemed an exercise of the police powers of the State of Texas, and of the City of Payne Springs, Texas, for the public safety, health, comfort, convenience and protection of the City and the citizens of said City, and all of the provisions hereof shall be construed for the accomplishment of that purpose.

Section 2: Whereas the City of Payne Springs, Texas, does not have an Ordinance prescribing the size tract of land on which an establishment may be located for the sale, serving or consuming of alcoholic beverages if the sale of alcoholic beverages is ever legalized in the City of Payne Springs, Texas, and there exists a necessity for which, and it shall be as follows:

If at any time alcoholic beverages sales are ever legalized in Payne Springs, Texas, it shall be unlawful to sell, serve or consume same within the City Limits of Payne Springs, Texas, in any establishment located on a tract of land less than thirty (30) acres in size and zoned commercial.

Section 3: Whoever shall be found guilty of violating this Ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00, and each day of such violation shall be deemed a separate offense.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication, as provided by law.
