

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MUNICIPAL COURT IN THE CITY OF PAYNE SPRINGS, TEXAS, AND FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A MUNICIPAL JUDGE BY THE MAYOR, WITH THE CONSENT AND APPROVAL OF THE CITY COUNCIL, TO PRESIDE OVER THE MUNICIPAL COURT FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS AND THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PAYNE SPRINGS, TEXAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYNE SPRINGS, TEXAS:

Section 1. This entire Ordinance is and shall be deemed an exercise of the police powers of the State of Texas and of the City of Payne Springs, Texas, for the public safety, health, comfort, convenience and protection of the City and the citizens of said City, and all of the provisions hereof shall be construed for the accomplishment of that purpose.

Section 2. Whereas, the City of Payne Springs, Texas, does not have a municipal court presided over by a municipal judge to enforce the Ordinances of the City of Payne Springs, Texas, to protect the City and the citizens of said City, and there exists a necessity for the establishment of a municipal court and the appointment of a municipal judge to preside over said court.

From and after the date of this Ordinance becomes effective, the Mayor of the City of Payne Springs, Texas, shall appoint a person, who in his judgment, is suitable to be the Municipal Judge of the Municipal Court of the City of Payne Springs, Texas, with the approval and consent of the City Council of said City, and the Mayor, with the consent and approval of the City Council shall provide for or designate a place for, a Municipal Court for the City of Payne Springs, Texas, to be presided over by the appointed Municipal Judge of said City, for the enforcement of the laws of the State of Texas, and the Ordinances of the City of Payne Springs, Texas.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication, as provided by law.
