

RESOLUTION 1994-10-18

A RESOLUTION TO REDUCE POTENTIAL TRAFFIC HAZARDS AT THE INTERSECTION OF CR 2515 AND CR 2516.

WHEREAS, the intersection of CR 2515, a north-south street in the City of Payne Springs known locally as Fraser Lane, and CR 2516 an east-west street in the City of Payne Springs known locally as Double Bridge Road, meet in a "Tee" intersection; and

WHEREAS, this intersection has no controlling traffic signs and has been the site of one or more vehicle damaging collisions; and

WHEREAS, an on-site inspection of this intersection by council members with a representative of the Texas Department of Transportation, experienced in traffic control, did conclude that signage at this intersection was needed to reduce the potential hazards;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF PAYNE SPRINGS, TEXAS that

SECTION 1. The City will cause to be erected a STOP sign on CR 2516 to stop west bound traffic approaching CR 2515, a white stripe perpendicular to traffic flow at the STOP sign, and a sign warning of a STOP ahead erected 500 to 700 feet before the STOP sign with an advisory speed sign of 25 MPH affixed below the warning sign.

SECTION 2. These signs shall be erected after the publishing of this Resolution in the *Cedar Creek Pilot*, the official newspaper of the City.

SECTION 3. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Resolution is passed is open to the public and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by law.
